Ivy Removal

Shed

The shed, which had been built sometime in the 20th century and was possibly used as a tool store by undertakers, was in a poor state. The roof tiles were removed, the rafters renewed and the tiles replaced

along with some identical ones from a farm at Oldhamstocks. A new door and window were also made to match the originals. Some interesting features of the original church were seen more clearly with the roof removed. These include an alcove with original plaster. Possibly the whole interior of the church would have been similarly coated when it was in use.
