

HERALDRY RELATING TO THE LAIRDS OF AYTON IN THE COUNTY OF BERWICK.

1. AYTON OF AYTON.

Argent, a cross engrailed between four roses Gules.

Note:- Recorded as AITON OF THAT ILK in the Public Register of all Arms and Bearings in Scotland.

2. HOME OF AYTON.

Quarterly: 1st and 4th Vert, a lion rampant argent, for Home; 2nd and 3rd Argent, three popinjays vert, beaked and membered Gules, for Pepdie; a rose Gules [Ayton] for difference.

Note:- These arms are not recorded in the Public Register of all Arms and Bearings in Scotland but are known to have been used by this family before the introduction of the Register.

3. FORDYCE OF AYTON.

Gules: a dagger in pale proper, point upwards, between three boars' heads coupé Or.

Note:- Recorded in the Public Register of all Arms and Bearings in Scotland in 1767.

4. MITCHELL-INNES OF AYTON.

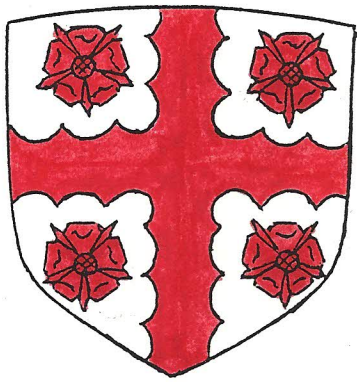
Quarterly: 1st and 4th Argent, three mullets of six points within a bordure Gules charged with eight besants, for Innes; 2nd and 3rd Sable, on a fess between three mascles Or three mullets Gules, for Mitchell.

Note:- The above arms were recorded in 1840 in the Public Register of all Arms and Bearings in Scotland for MITCHELL-INNES OF PARSONS GREEN.

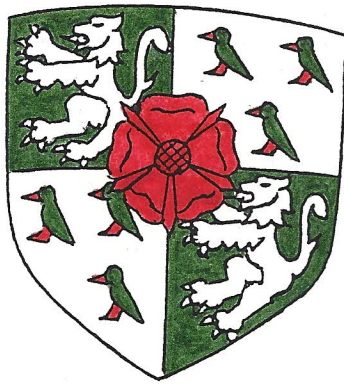
5. LIDDLE-GRANGER OF AYTON.

Quarterly: 1st and 4th Azure, on a pale Or two pomegranates stalked leaved and slipped proper, over all a fess investé Ermine, thereon a quatrefoil between two portcullises with chains Sable for Grainger; 2nd Argent fretty Gules, two voiders Or, on a chief of the second an estoile between two leopards' heads erased of the third, for Liddell; 3rd Argent, three battering rams barways in pale proper headed and garnished Azure, for Lindsey.

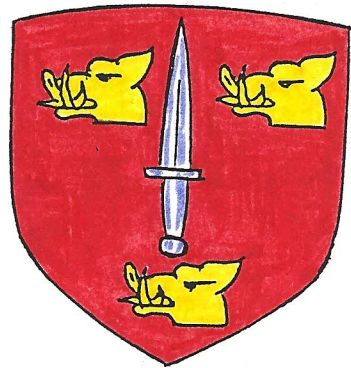

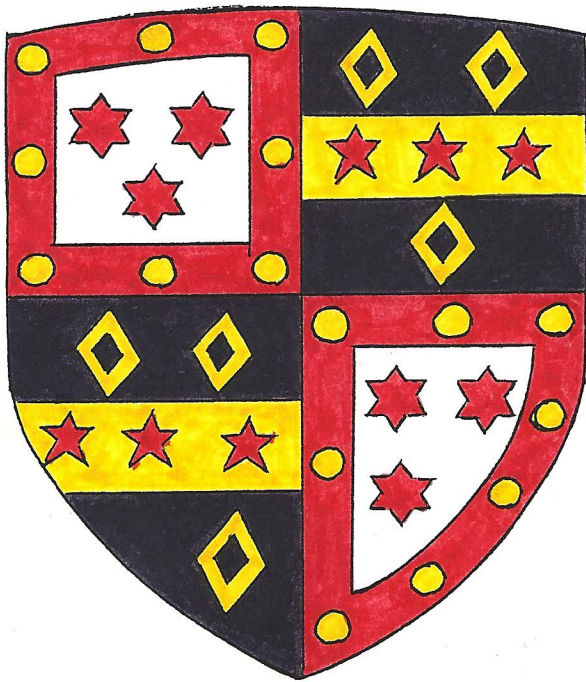

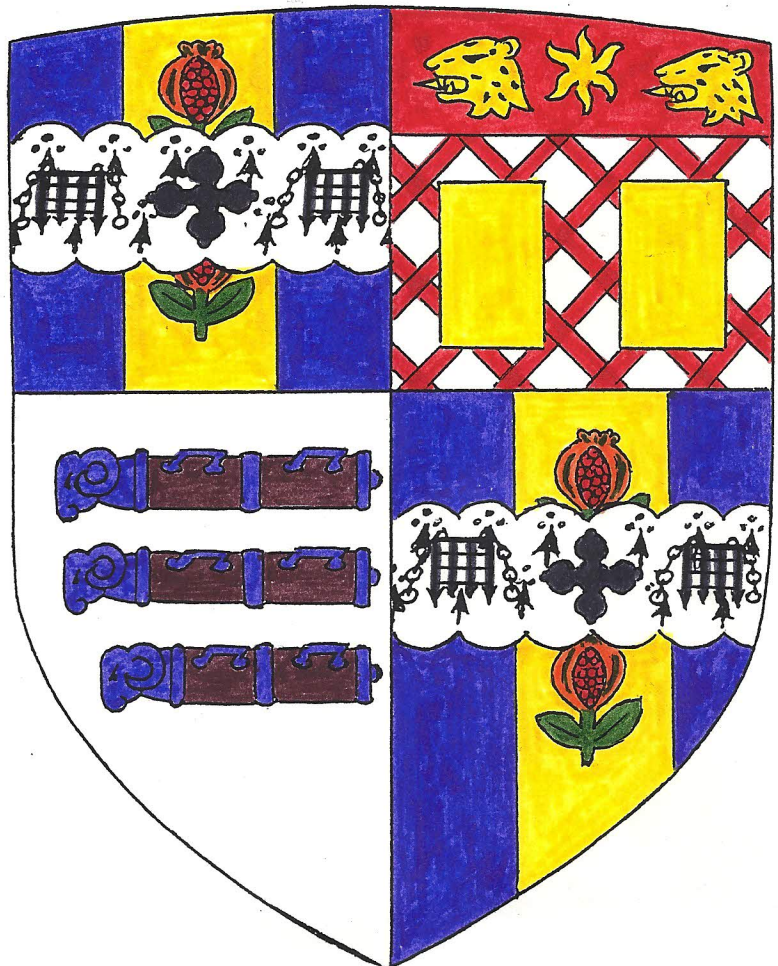
